TRIP TO PORTOBELLO.

The trip of the Golden Age to Portobello was fairly successful, about 300 excursionists availing themselves of the opportunity. The strong gale which was blowing was not much felt on the run down, although on coming out of Macandrew's Bay, where a few passengers were landed, the sea made sundry incursions upon the deck of the boat, to the great discomfort of not a few who had made themselves very comfortable in snug corners. Portobello jetty was reached about noon, and the company immediately dispersed themselves all over the locality. M. Fleury's band remained at the hotel near the jetty, and played a selection of airs. The strength of the gale seemed to increase as the tide fell, and several pelting showers drove all and sundry back to the hotel, or its precincts, for shelter. The steamer was soon descried coming over from Port Chalmers, and

punctually came alongside the jetty. The discomfort, however, was intensified here. The jetty is only a short platform, with a handrail on one side ; but the wind blew so strongly across the bay, that it was with the utmost difficulty and even danger that the ladies and children could be conveyed to the steamer's gangway. Hats, caps, bonnets, and all sorts of head gear, masculine and feminine, went flying off. About half a dozen were in the air at once ; altogether some 30 went to sea on independent voyages, even M. Fleury's uniform cap went among the rest. It was as much as the steamer could do to weather some of the points on the way up. At times the sea was driven before the wind like as much smoke, and the spray flew over on the deck, making every one crowd for shelter under the lee of the engine-house, &c. The old jetty was reached at six o'clock, it having taken the steamer just an hour and a half to make the run home.

Almost 10,000 Possums!




The Otago Peninsula Biodiversity Group (OPBG) is rapidly approaching a total of 10,000 possums removed from the Otago Peninsula! This incredible achievement is all thanks to a huge five-year effort from volunteers, residents, contractors, the team at OPBG, and our funders and supporters. This is great progress towards achieving OPBG's goal of a possum-free Peninsula by the end of 2018, BUT, we can't stop now! So, it's still all hands on deck to keep up the great work and keep moving forward.

OPBG's Operations Manager, Bruce Kyle, is currently cracking down on the annual possum winter migration. The Otago Peninsula's steep temperature gradient, from cooler remote coastal areas to warmer harbour side residential areas, results in highly-mobile possums seeking food and shelter. As winter southerlies blast into prime possum coastal hangouts, such as Boulder Beach, possums literally head for the hills, seeking out gullies and tree belts of native vegetation cover. But, these territories quickly become crowded causing possums to 'spill over' to the harbour side in search of alternative prime real estate, such as native bush, gorse flower, vegie gardens, and compost heaps. Bruce noticed this migration starting a few weeks ago, so **NOW** is the perfect time for everyone to set a Timms trap and assist OPBG in trying to reduce the current wave of possums. The best place to set your Timms trap is between a big 'play' tree (look for scratch or bite marks on the bark) and some thick scrub cover. Some Statistics



Did you know tamarillos are a relative of the potato, tomato, and eggplant and is native to Central and South America? Known as the Tree Tomato it too was an early settler. But in 1967 its name was changed to avoid confusion with the common garden tomato. The new word with a similarity to the English word "tomato, cleverly combined a Maori word "Tama" and a Spanish word "Amarillo" to make up the new name, Tamarillo.

Goes from strength to strength

The Education Review Office (ERO) recently reviewed our school. They do this periodically to all NZ Schools. The purpose of these reviews is to assess how well a school is meeting its goals and ultimately the education of our children. Their focus for this review was Māori achievement. During their visit they spoke to pupils, staff and Board members and collated much information. As you can probably imagine these reviews are significant and are immensely important to our school and community.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees I am delighted to report that Portobello School has received an extremely positive report. There were few recommendations of significance and acknowledgment of many positive aspect, including, but not limited to:

- Our high Māori student achievement across all curriculum areas
- Matched by our high and sustained achievement across all curriculum areas
 - o 80% at or above for reading
 - o More than 75% achieving well in both maths and writing
 - o This level of achievement has been sustained over the last 3 years

Our effective leadership, strong use of achievement information and continued efforts to build teaching capability means that the school is well placed to sustain these high levels of achievement.

Our sustained levels of student achievement:

The 2015 National Standards will be published nationally, shortly. We as a school are very proud of our sustained levels of achievement. I have included the previous 2 years for comparison. The granular data that makes this up is available and should you wish to see it, please contact me directly.



Calling for nominations for the Community Board

If you are interested and want to know what is involved – please contact myself or one of the OPCB members urgently. Also, don't forget to enrol to vote – deadline this Friday!

Local Government Election 2016

12th August – Nominations close 12 noon, electoral rolls close

16th-21st Sept - Voting papers delivered (voting is by postal vote)

8th Oct - Voting closes 12 noon

Roading updates:

- ♦ Highcliff Rd near Seal Pt Rd (*aka Two car slip*): contractor and programme of works due to be announced this week
- ♦ Package of four slip repairs at Highcliff Rd at Sandymount/Seven Devils/ Soldiers Monument/ Hatchery Rd: tender documents out in next fortnight
- ♦ Portobello/Harington Pt Road Safety Improvement Project – successful tenderer for professional services is expected to be announced in the coming fortnight. The Board has been advised that physical works will begin in March 2017
- ♦ Damage to the sea wall edging: the Board has advised Council that this unsightly damage needs to be addressed, at the latest before the beginning of the summer season

Other updates

- ♦ Te Rauone: Port Otago recently engaged engineering firm Beca to review the project as part of the process toward lodging the resource consent. Port Otago's Board has stated it is fully committed to a positive outcome for this project. The OPCB commends and supports the considerable efforts by Te Rauone Beach Coast Care Committee to get the very best outcome for our community and has the OPCB's full support
- ♦ The Board has identified the already consented and partially formed ramp (*adjacent to the Portobello jetty & part of Stage 3 of the jetty development*) as a priority for the community and is currently exploring ways to achieve its completion as soon as possible
- ♦ The Board has been lobbying ORC for five years to have a named, full time harbour master for Otago Harbour – this process is now underway
- ♦ Remnants of old sand sausages have found their way onto Peninsula beaches. While measures have been put in place to prevent it getting in the water, if you do come across any of this material on our Peninsula beaches, please phone Council 4774000 urgently, so that this material can be removed. The Board continues to lobby Government and Chorus directly re continued delays in the announcement about which areas will receive Rural Broadband
- ♦ The Board is continuing dialogue with relevant agencies over expected growth this upcoming season in visitor numbers and therefore, visitor drivers. Prevention first is the message we are taking to all agencies involved, rather than waiting for a tragedy to occur. There is still work to be done on this and each of us needs to play our part as we welcome visitors to the Peninsula. However, if you witness poor driving by anyone, local or visitor, calling *555 from your cell phone is still the best way to report it.
