The Boating Safety Code serves as a quick reminder of the key points:


Life jackets: Safe enjoyable boating means taking and wearing your life jackets as the unexpected can so quickly happen.


Skipper responsibility: Every skipper has both a legal and moral responsibility to everyone onboard.



The daffodils in the Museum garden by the lighthouse are looking a picture at the moment.



Term 3 was an action packed term at Portobello school and students and staff enjoyed taking part in a wide range of different learning opportunities. Students in all classrooms learnt about the important role New Zealand plays in the global world and how we are connected to other countries. As part of this learning Room 4 visited a dairy farm to further their knowledge of the process that milk goes through from grass to glass.

The Peninsula Art Exhibition, Stars on Stage and Polyfest provided wonderful learning opportunities in the arts for all students during the term. Students loved participating in these activities which were well supported by our school community. Room 3 students took part in the Dunedin Ukulele Jam and had a lot of fun playing in the massed songs with other Dunedin schools. A group of students also represented our school at the Omathalon.

Room 4 students undertook a fascinating science and environmental project with Paula Cross from Roselle Farm. As part of this project students looked at water testing carried out in 2016, visited Granton Creek and used the SHMAK kit to water test and visited Citilab to observe and learn about water testing for nitrates by scientists. Students will now analyse the results from the testing and consider how fencing and planting might be undertaken to enhance the water quality and create more aquatic biodiversity. Our Enviro Group have also been working hard around the school on environmental projects. A large number of trees were planted in our tree reserve and low bushes were planted in the area between the pool and the playcentre.

Our Disability Bathroom project has now been completed and the bathroom is now in use.

We farewelled our caretaker Bruce Callister at the end of Term 3 after many years working at our school. We welcome our new caretaker Graeme McNulty to our school community.

We planted number of native seedlings on our August and September Open Days, thanks to our volunteers and community members on these days and to the Sargood Bequest for funding the trees, and the DCC Biodiversity grant which helps us subsidise boat fares.

We've had a number of visitors choosing to stay in the Lodge overnight too. The combined Opoho, Mosgiel and Port Chalmers Guides enjoyed an overnight stay, a tour of the island's history and biodiversity project, including a bird count, with help from Clare Cross, Dries (island Keeper) and community members. The island also hosted the Blue Oyster Art Project Space, as part of the UKU/UTU, a wananga, rather than a traditional art exhibition.

The Island is a wonderful place for creativity, and quiet reflection. The QIKT Community is excited to be able to offer an artist a short term paid residency on the Island this summer (1 - 2 weeks, preferably in January). Details are on our website quarantineisland.org.nz

Otago Peninsula Biodiversity Group

OPBG would like to introduce Nathan McNally our new manager. Nathan is originally from Dunedin and studied Marine Science and Zoology at Otago. He has been previously involved with mainly sea lion related work on the Peninsula. He joins us after several years away from the south, most recently based in Whangarei as a Biosecurity Officer for the regional council and a 2.5 years stint on the Falkland Islands where he worked on a wide range of projects such as penguin and albatross monitoring to deploying and retrieving tracking devices. Nathan worked for DOC for several years on the Chatham Islands and Pitt Island, sub-Antarctic Auckland and Campbell Islands and at Macraes Flat.

At DOC he was involved in a variety of projects from petrel and black robin translocations, mammal eradications, species monitoring and protection (sea birds, pinnipeds, shore birds, forest birds and skinks), community engagement, island biosecurity. He ran the field component of the successful landscape scale mammal pest control operation Macraes Flat, controlling introduced mammalian pests through trapping, shooting across around 10,000 ha and use of mammal proof exclusion fencing. Nathan joined the project early August and is accompanied by his partner Amélie and new baby Aléric and their springer spaniel Kopi.





ANOTHER DAY IN PARADISE from Olly's laptop

Last issue I wrote about the ODT article which reported my saying that our city could be a City of Peace – and I meant it. We certainly have tons of that out here on the peninsula – and we love it. I'm not one to be selfish but I like the fact that many people don't like to live out here because to them it's so far away!!! We go into town only when we need to for shopping and entertainment – otherwise – we stay right here. We've got cockles right outside our door – we can fish off the wharf and we can gather edible seaweed as well.

A few days ago a car pulled up just outside our place. Some Asian people got out and a couple of them donned gumboots and wet gear, a couple of bags and went down onto the sand collecting sea weed – the type my mother referred to as karengo. I assumed the people were Japanese as karengo is closely related to their nori.

Traditionally karengo was picked and sun-dried in the winter months. It keeps for a long time in a dry condition. When used in cooking the dried seaweed is steamed or simmered for 30 minutes whereupon it becomes soft – not unlike steamed pasta in texture. It's delicious - a delicacy to Maori and Japanese.

On another note – it was so great to see the Coronation Hall packed out for our Volunteer Fire Service Fund-Raising evening. A very enjoyable night was had by all. A big UPS to the men and women who give of their time freely to take care of us in more ways than one.

And talking about caring – we've got a challenge ahead of us – to get the Groynes under way so that people's homes don't get reclaimed by the sea. Historically; had the City Council and Port Otago maintained the old groynes Te Rauone beach would still be with us today but sadly, that's not the case – and now private residences are being threatened by the sea. Since the port has increased its dredging, naturally the sand has been falling away at its edges. It's already cost residents along Te Rauone a lot of money so far and we need to get the Port to put into action what they promised.



STOP News

Thank you to those of you who responded to the request for funds for planting in the last newsletter.

Luckily the crisis is now over, with your funds added to a thousand trees now pledged by Otago Polytechnic (they levy staff when they travel, including between campuses, and this becomes a carbon offsetting fund).



Approximately 1,600 trees and shrubs have been planted this year so far, mainly on the Smiths Creek site, with only another 150 to go. Do come along and help get them in the ground, before the planting season finishes. Thanks to Ian and René in particular, who have done most of the ground preparation for a thousand plants. Thanks also to the DCC's Task Force Green and Community Workers who have cut tracks and also cleared some of the spaces in readiness for the planters, as well as removing gorse around the plantings and in the wetland.

Instead of the Hereweka Hike, taking walkers to the top of Harbour Cone, this year the Hereweka Harbour Cone Management Trust is joining with Save The Otago Peninsula (STOP) to run a **"Future Forest Walk"** that will allow you to visit the Smiths Creek Catchment plantings that started in 2013. This will probably be in the first weekend of November. Many of the trees planted by local volunteers in the past three years up a side tributary are not obvious, so this is an opportunity to see them. The Short Walk will go through the 2013 – 2016 plantings alongside the main creek, and the Community Orchard, while the extension to form a Long Walk (some hill climbing required) will go up through the 2017 to 2019 plantings. This will also take you through the wetland with dry feet over the boardwalk bridge made by Ian and volunteers with offcuts surplus to requirements from the Walkway/Cycleway construction kindly supplied by Fulton Hogan. Incidentally the 2019 plantings can currently be seen clearly on Google Earth because of the jute sacks (courtesy of Greggs), used as weedmats.




